 - (c) What does the speaker lament in the poem, I Say unto Waris Shah?
 - (d) Which powerful weapon is released by Ashwatthama?
 - (e) What does the black night signify in 'Light, Oh Where is the Light?'?
 - (f) Who is Shyambandhu in Rebati?

- (g) How much cash was Ghisu able to collect for the funeral rites?
- (h) In The Land of the Half-Humans, what do the women look like?
- (i) What kind of work did Budhiya do?
- (j) In what language was Chughtai's story, The Quilt originally written?

 - (a) Who was Waris Shah? Why did Amrita Pritam invoke Shah?
 - (b) "Leaves of our blood-stained epics fly in our flight." Why does Muktibodh allude to epics?
 - (c) How do Ghisu and Madhav justify their actions at the end of the story?
 - (d) Why does the poet say that the jaws of the void have 'carnivorous teeth'?
 - (e) Why does the narrator compare showing compassion to Ghisu and Madhav to dying a black blanket?
- 3. Answer any four of the following questions:

(a) Critically comment on the structure of the poem, So Very Far.

- (b) Briefly discuss the significance of Ashwatthama's metamorphosis in Andha Yug.
- (c) Explain the theme of Partition in I Say unto Waris Shah.
- (d) Write a short note on the significance of the title, *The Shroud*.
- (e) Write a brief note on the themes explored in Bhabendranath Saikia's short story, Celebration.
- (f) Comment on the theme of oppression in the story, *The Quilt*.
- 4. Answer the following questions: 10×4=40
 - (a) In *The Shroud*, Premchand re-examines the much-romanticised benefits of 'honest hard work' in a caste-ridden society. Discuss.

Or

Andha Yug depicts the loss of moral values in contemporary times through a symbolic treatment of characters and situations from the Mahabharata. Discuss.

(b) Write a critical appreciation of Amrita Pritam's I Say unto Waris Shah with reference to the gendered nature of violence during the Partition of India.

Or

Discuss how the poems of Ibopishak offer a critique of the political corruption and social unrest in contemporary Manipur.

(c) How does the story, Rebati depict the plight of the women in 18th century Odisha? Answer with suitable illustrations from the text.

Or

Write a note on the character of Begum Jaan.

(d) Critically examine Tagore's spiritual quest with reference to the prescribed poems.

Or

"Muktibodh's *The Void* uses a number of images to bring out the psychological disturbance of the speaker." Discuss.
