#### CODE OF ETHICS AND CONDUCT FOR STUDENTS

#### **PREAMBLE**

This Handbook indicates the standard procedures and practices of Bhola Nath College, Dhubri (hereinafter referred to as the 'Institute') for all students enrolling with the Institute for pursuing different courses. All students must know that it is incumbent upon them to abide by this Code of Ethics and Conduct (hereinafter referred to as the 'Code') and the rights, responsibilities including the restrictions flowing from it. That the Institute's endeavour by means of enforcing this Code is to pioneer and administer a student discipline process that is egalitarian, conscientious, effectual and expenditious; and providing a system which promotes student growth through individual and collective responsibility.

All Students are expected to be well conversant with this Code, which can be also reviewed on the official website of the Institute.

#### 1. Conduct

The code depicted underneath shall apply to all sorts of conduct of students within the college premises and their off-campus mannerism which may have serious consequences or adverse impact on the Institute's interests or reputation. At the time of admission, each student would have to sign a statement consenting to abide by the framed codes and should also affirm undertakings that. (i) The student shall be regular in the classes and must complete his/her studies in the Institute, (ii) In case, the student is forced to discontinue studies for any legitimate reason, he/she may be relieved from the Institution subject to the written consent of the College Authority. (iii) If the student is relieved from the college, he/she shall have to clear all pending dues and if the student had joined the Institute on a scholarship, the said grant shall be revoked. The College believes in promoting a safe and efficient climate by enforcing behavioural standards. All students must uphold academic integrity. They should be respectful to all persons, to their rights and duties, to the college property and to the safety of others. All students must deter from indulging in any and all forms of misconduct including partaking in any off-campus activity, which may affect the Institute's interests and reputation substantially.

#### The various forms of Misconduct, the Students are expected to refrain from, include:

- A. Any act of discrimination (physical or verbal) based on an individual's gender identity, caste, race, religion or religious beliefs, colour, region, language, disability, marital or family status, physical or mental disability etc.
- **B**. Intentionally damaging or destroying Institute's property or property of other students and/or Faculty members & Support staffs.
- C. Any disruptive activity in a class room or in an event sponsored by the College.
- D. Inability to produce the identity card, issued by the Institution, or refusing to produce it on demand by campus security personnel.

#### E. Participating in activities including:

- a) Organizing meetings and processions without permission from the Institution.
- b) Accepting membership of any groups banned by the Institution or by the State or Central Government.
- c) Unauthorized possession, carrying or use of any weapon, ammunition, explosives or potential weapons, fireworks contrary to low or policy.
- d) Unauthorized possession or use of harmful chemicals and banned drugs.
- e) Smoking within the College campus.
- f) Possessing, consuming, distributing, selling of alcohol in the Institution and/or throwing empty bottles on the campus of the Institute.
- g) Parking a vehicle (Four wheeler / Two wheeler / Bicycle etc.) in a no parking zone or in the area earmarked for other than the students.

- h) Rash driving on the campus that may cause any inconvenience to others.
- *i)*Not disclosing a pre-existing health condition, either physical or psychological which may cause hindrance to the academic progress of the student.
- *j*) Pilfering or unauthorized access to the resources of others.
- **k)** Misdemeanour and/or exhibiting disruptive attitude at the time of Students' body elections or during any activity of the Institute.
- *l)* Engaging in disorderly, lewd or indecent conduct creating unreasonable noise, pushing and shoving, inciting or participating in a riotous or group disruption at the Institute.
- **F**. Students are expected not to interact, on behalf of the Institution, with media representatives or invite media persons on to the campus without the permission of the authorities of the institute.
- **G**. Students are not permitted to do recording of either audio or video of the lectures delivered in class rooms, actions of other students, faculty or staff without prior permission.
- **H**. Students are not permitted to provide audio and video clippings of any activity in the campus to print and/or electronic media without prior permission.
- I. Students are expected to be careful and responsible and exercise restraints while using the Social Media. They should desist from posting derogatory comments about other individuals of the Institute and refrain from indulging in such other related activities having grave ramifications on the reputation of the Institute.
- J. Causing damage to or destruction of any property of the College or any property of others at the premises would invite punishment.

A committee will be there to look after any possible breach of the aforesaid codes of conduct by a student. It will inquire into the alleged violation and accordingly recommend suitable disciplinary action against the said student. The committee may give a hearing to the student to ascertain the misconduct and suggest one or more disciplinary actions based on the nature of misconduct.

#### 2. Academic Integrity

Academic integrity is essential for the success of an Institution and its research missions as well, and hence its violation constitutes a serious offense. The Policy on academic integrity forms an integral part of the Code which applies to all students of the Institution to which they should adhere. Failure to uphold these principles shall threaten both the reputation of the Institution and the value of the degrees awarded to its students. Every student of the Institution should feel responsible to ensure the highest standards of academic integrity.

#### The principles of academic integrity require that a student should

- a. Properly acknowledge and cite use of the ideas, results, material or words of others.
- b. Properly acknowledge all contributors to a given piece of work.
- c. Make sure that all assignments in a course done and submitted are his/her own.
- d. Perform academic activities without the aid of impermissible materials or results by ethical means and report them accurately without suppressing any results inconsistent with his/her interpretation or conclusions.
- $e.\ Have\ right\ to\ pursue\ their\ educational\ goals\ without\ interference.$
- f. Refrain from cheating. It includes: (1) Copying during examinations, and copying of homework assignments, project report etc. (2) Allowing or facilitating copying, or writing a report or taking examination for someone else. (3) Using unauthorized material, copying, collaborating when not authorized, and purchasing or borrowing papers or material from various sources. (4) Fabricating (making up) or falsifying (manipulating) data and reporting them in publications. (5) Creating sources, or citations that do not exist (6)Altering previously evaluated and re-submitting the work for re-evaluation (7) Signing another student's name on an assignment, report, research paper or attendance sheet.

#### Anti-Ragging

The Institution has a coherent and an effective anti-ragging policy in place which is based on the 'UGC Regulation on Curbing the Menace of Ragging in Higher Educational Institutions, 2009' (hereinafter referred to as the 'UGC Regulations'). The UGC Regulations have been framed in view of the directions issued by the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India to prevent and prohibit ragging in all Indian Educational Institutions and Colleges. The said UGC Regulations shall apply mutatis mutandis to the Institution. Ragging constitutes one or more of the following acts:

- a) any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any student;
- **b)** indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which cause or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any other student;
- c) asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such a student;
- d) any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic ctivity of any student;
- e) exploiting the services of a student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;
- f) any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a student by other students;
- g) any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health of a student;
- **h)** any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to any other student;
- *i)* any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any other student.

Anti-Ragging Committee: The Institute's Anti-Ragging Committee shall examine all complaints of anti-ragging and come out with recommendation based on the nature of the incident.

Anti-Ragging Squad: To render assistance to students, an Anti-Ragging Squad, which is a smaller body, has also been constituted consisting of various members of the campus community. The said Squad shall keep a vigil on ragging incidents taking place in the community and undertake patrolling functions. Students may note that the Squad is active and alert at all times and are empowered to inspect places of potential ragging, and also make surprise raids in hostels and other hotspots in the College. The Squad can also investigate incidents of ragging and make recommendations to the Anti-Ragging Committee and shall work under the guidance of the Anti-Ragging Committee.

A student found guilty by the committee will be imposed one or more of the following punishments, as recommended by the Anti-Ragging Committee:

- i. Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
- ii. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
- iii. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
- iv. Withholding results.
- v. Suspension/expulsion from the hostels and mess.
- vi. Cancellation of admission.
- Vii. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period. i) In cases where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institute shall resort to collective punishment.
- Viii. If need be, in view of the intensity of the act of ragging committed, a First Information Report (FIR) shall be filed by the Institute with the local police authorities.

The Anti-Ragging Committee of the Institute shall take appropriate decision, including imposition of punishment, depending on the facts and circumstances of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging.

#### 4. Gender Discrimination and Allied Harassment

For prevention and prohibition of sexual harassment at workplace, the Institution has a functional committee for Anti Sexual Harassment. Students should note that sexual misconduct or harassment encompasses a range of conduct, including but not limited to sexual assault, unwanted touching or persistent unwelcome comments, e-mails, or pictures of an insulting or degrading sexual nature, which may constitute harassment, which shall depend on the circumstances of each case. Any such instances will be investigated and punishment will be given by the committee. The committee will decide (as it deems fit) the nature of punishment against the nature of the incident occurred.

#### Bachelor of Computer Application (BCA)

BCA is a Three-year Degree Course consisting of 6 semesters.

Eligibility: The candidate must have passed Higher Secondary or equivalent examination from Science/Arts/Commerce. Students who have passed the Higher Secondary examination with either Mathematics or Computer Science as one of the subjects obtaining minimum pass marks in the subject will be given preference. Students completing Diploma in CSE/IT from AICTE recognized institutes are also eligible for admission.

#### vi) B.Voc. in IT (BACHELOR OF VOCATIONAL COURSE ON INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY): (Sponsored by the Govt. of Assam)

From the academic session 2017-18, the college has introduced the Bachelor in Vocational course (IT). As per Govt. Instruction, the number of seats in this course is fixed at twenty only.

#### vii) P.G. Course in ASSAMESE: -

The College offers P.G. Course in Assamese under Gauhati University. The course duration is two years consisting of four semesters. Seat capacity is limited.

#### viii) P.G. Course in CHEMISTRY :-

The College offers P.G. Course in Chemistry under Gauhati University. The course duration is two years consisting four semesters. Seat capacity is limited.

#### ix) P.G. Diploma Course in COMPUTER APPLICATION (PGDCA) :-

The College offers P.G. Diploma in Computer Application (PGDCA) in regular mode under Gauhati University.

#### x) OPEN & DISTANCE LEARNING SYSTEM: -

The College has been offering Post Graduate Course since 2006 through its Study Centre of "Institute of Distance and Open Learning" (IDOL) under Gauhati University. Besides various diploma courses, the centre offers Post Graduate Courses in Assamese, English, Economics, History, Political Science, Mathematics, Commerce, Philosophy and Journalism & Mass Communication. Contact classes are held at regular interval and examinations of all the above courses are held at B. N. college as per the rules and regulations of IDOL, Gauhati university.

#### Community Outreach Programme:

As a part of its social responsibility, the college, has been rendering services and carrying out different activities in the neighbourhood areas.



#### C. Admission procedure (How to Apply)

1. Students seeking admission for Degree 1<sup>st</sup> semester and HS 1<sup>st</sup> year classes can apply online by clicking the tab "Online Admission Form" available on the home page of www.bncollege.co.in. Students applying simultaneously for different streams must apply separately.





#### D. Admission Procedure



Students seeking admission will first apply by filling up the online form to be made available in the college website. They will be selected on merit basis and the merit list will be published in the college website and sms will be sent to the registered mobile number of the selected student. Finally, selected students have to accept the admission offer by logging in the admission portal through their user ID and password to get themselves admitted.

#### E. Reservation of Seats



There is a provision for reservation of seats for students belonging to SC,ST(P), ST(H), OBC, MOBC and differently abled categories and Sports Quota as per Govt. Rules. The candidates of reserved categories shall have to produce valid certificate issued by the competent authority.



#### F. Rules & Regulations



- # Ragging is strictly prohibited in the college campus.
- # Students remaining absent for consecutive 15 days in major classes will forfeit their seats in major courses.

Attendance of students in Classes, Laboratory works and Tutorial Classes are compulsory. Students attending individual classes up to 75% or above in the H.S. (both 1<sup>st</sup> Year & 2<sup>nd</sup> year) classes are allowed to appear in the A.H.S.E.C. Examination while students attending individual classes in semester course up to 75% or above are allowed to appear as regular candidates at the University Examinations. For private and casual students (with specific subjects) specific University regulations will be applicable. Students' class attendance will be calculated every month. Students failing to attend 75% of the total lectures delivered will be treated as non-collegiate and such students have to pay Non-collegiate fee as per G.U. rules. The students having class attendance less than 60% will be treated as dis-collegiate and such students will be debarred from appearing in sessional and end semester examinations.

#### G. Teaching and Evaluation



The College follows the ACADEMIC CALENDAR of Gauhati University and A.H.S.E.C. for UG and H.S. courses respectively. Besides, the college has got its own Academic Calendar showing total no. of working days, teaching days and dates and time for various Internal Examinations. The College has its own mechanism to evaluate he performance of the students for continuous evaluation through Diagnostic test and Mid term test and thereby maintaining quality education. The College has shown excellent result all along.

In addition to normal class room teaching, the college imparts teaching by organizing Seminars, departmental Seminars, Tutorial classes etc. The evaluation process is continuous and based on the students progress in class, home assignments, Unit test, laboratory works(for science Stream), field works and Examinations.

#### H. Disciplinary action



The student admitted to the College must abide by the rules and regulations of the College. Violation of the rules, irregular attendance, irregular payment of College and Hostel dues and fees, showing discourtesy to the teacher and employees in any form, ragging, adopting of unfair means in the examination and loitering are strictly prohibited. Causing damage to the College properties, smoking, taking alcoholic beverages and intoxicating drugs within the campus or in the public places are some of the offenses which may make a student liable for disciplinary action, Viz., forced transfer, termination of scholarship and even expulsion from the College and Hostel.

#### I. Students Support Services



- \* **Digital Classroom**: The College has Modern Digital Classroom facility.
- † Hostel Accommodation: At present the College has a Girls' Hostel having a capacity for 116 students with adequate facilities. There are two Boys' Hostel having 54 seats with adequate facilities in the College Campus.
- Library: The College Central Library is well-equipped with computer system (automation), Internet Connectivity and a Reading Room, e-resources, Reference Section catering to the needs of teachers, students and employees of the College. Its total collection of reading materials including Text Books, Reference Resources, general Books and a few sets of Encyclopedias is more than 47,250. There is a Digital Library as a wing of the central Library, a soft copy corner with e-book. Besides National and International e-books, e-journals are available with N-list (INFLIBNET) facility in the library.
  - The Central Library has Book Bank facilities for the Students belonging to ST/SC and other backward communities.
- **Biotech Hub**: Biotech Hub funded by Department of Biotechnology, Govt. of India was established in 2012 for promoting higher research. Students of this college and from the nearby institutions get an exposure of research in Biotechnology, Microbiology and Molecular Biology etc.
- \*\* B.N. College Cricket Academy: The College has established 'B. N. College Cricket Academy' under the active guidance of Mr. Javed Zaman, an alumnus of the College and Ex. Member of Indian A cricket team and now working as NCA level B Coach. This academy aims to train up the students of the college and of the local youths as well as to impart knowledge and skill of cricket.
- †† Career Counseling and placement Cell: This cell provides 'Career Guidance' to the students by distinguished experts and organizes classes on current affairs and general knowledge etc.
- **##** Grievances and Redressal Cell: The College has a 'Grievances and Redressal Cell' to address the grievances of students and staff.
- **Yoga Centre and Gymnasium Centre**: The College has 'Yoga and Gymnasium Centre' within the campus to create health awareness among its employees (Teaching & Non-teaching), Students and outsiders.
- \*\*\* Computer Lab: Computer lab was established in the College in 2010. Beside the department B.Voc. (IT), Physics and Mathematics have separate computer lab with internet facility.
- ††† Health Centre: The College has a "Health Centre" in the campus, which is managed by the college authority.
- **‡‡‡ Scholarship**: The following Scholarship are available for students studying in the College.

  - 4. Ishan Uday Scholarship from UGC only for Degree students.
  - \* Students aid Fund: There is a 'Student Aid Fund' in the College to provide financial assistance to students coming from economically weaker section of the society.
  - \* Educational Excursion: The students of the College are generally encouraged to participate in educational excursion. For the students of Botany & Zoology of T.D.C. (Science) classes, departmental educational excursion is made compulsory by G.U. Besides, an Environmental Excursion is compulsory for all Degree 4<sup>th</sup> semester and H.S. 1<sup>st</sup> year students of Arts, Science and Computer Application courses.
  - \* Students Club: The College has established few students club Viz., Debate, Drama, Arts and Drawing, Literacy, Electronic, Dance and Photography. The aim of these clubs is to nurture the creativity of the students and to encourage interest and knowledge about various aspects of human resource management.


After completing the B.A. Course the students are expected to acquire:
